At Rankin, we offer additional math support to individual students who need it via our Response to Intervention/Multi-Tiered System of Supports Program. Providing support is a result of our ongoing progress monitoring of each of our individual students. Periodically, it is determined that individual students need and will benefit from additional support and guidance. This is where Mrs. Diane Wattles steps in to help!



Mrs. Wattles began at Rankin as a substitute paraprofessional/aide eleven years ago. After three years of substituting, Mrs. Wattles was then hired as an RTI Paraprofessional. Now, she is completing her 8th year in this position. Dr. Matt Gordon, Superintendent, commented on Mrs. Wattles success, "She is very knowledgeable about our math content, curriculum, and learning standards across the K-8 grade levels. She is an expert at providing the specific, individual support and guidance that each student needs to help them feel more comfortable and confident in their math skills. Mrs. Wattles is a great asset to Rankin, as working with students in an individual or small group atmosphere can be instrumental in improving their foundation, which leads to greater future success."
